17:00	951	How to increase the percentage of female physicists? <i>Barbara Kessler, Rhein Ahr Campus</i> Still many young females hesitate to decide in favour of a career in physics or engineering. Their decision may be based on prejudices although many of them might be highly talented in these fields. Thereby they miss advantages like the very good job opportunities compared to other less promising professions. Also more females students will reduce the lack of highly educated physicists and engineers. Several programs aim to increase the interest of girls in natural sciences during their early high school years. In addition, there are tailor-made support programs for female physicists and couples. The talk will describe several examples of such programs in Germany.
